## **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

Our new sermon series is called "Stepping Out of the Boat." That's an ironic title for me to use: I'm not much for stepping out of boats myself! I used to water ski some when I was younger, but I wasn't very good at it. I had a friend who was. He would, while still standing in the boat, grasp the end of the rope tied to the boat and literally just step out of the boat and start skiing! I wouldn't have believed it if I hadn't seen it. He would gradually work his way down to the handle at the end of the rope, skiing all the while. Oh, and by the

way, he was barefooted, I suppose I should mention that! I never stepped out of a boat like that.

I never did it the way Peter did, either. He gets a lot of abuse for speaking before he thought, and he deserves some of that. And he d id "sink" after just a few seconds of walking on the water. (You remember that story, don't you? Matthew 14:22-33 tells it.)

But none of the other 11 got out of the boat at all! And his "seconds" of actually walking on the water are the only ones ever recorded, other than Jesus'! Wonder what it felt like? Winds whipping, sea-spray all over you—had to be exhilarating, right? He'd never done anything like that before...I'm sure he regretted sinking, looking at the waves instead of Jesus, etc. But do you think he regretted him asking Jesus call to him, hearing that call, and stepping over the rail? I suspect he did not!

It wasn't easy for him to do that. Stepping out of the boat never is! The boat is safe. Reasonably dry. And, compared with the alternative of battling winds and waves, it's safe. The

boat is all we know. I feel a metaphor coming on, don't you? I suspect our lives are like that boat. OK, kind of dry, kind of safe, very familiar. We might gripe about our boats/lives, but we aren't likely to go over the rail any time soon.

But maybe we should! We should listen for Jesus' call, of course. We don't want risk for risk's sake! But I believe from the moment He first calls us to trust Him our

> lives with Him are a continual series of times when asks us to take a risk, to jump over the edge, to take on something way out of our comfort zone, something we've never done before! Might be something we abhor. Or something we fear. Or something that would be our last choice. Still, He is there. And we hear His call!

> Churches have to take risks. Preachers do, missionaries do, Elders do, leaders do.

And all believers... what of them? Them too. Over the side you go! Let's step out—together!

I look forward to this series, and to taking some risks with you! God bless you and yours—



Ever wonder what happens when you drop an item in the buggy? Let me answer that. First, the items go to our living room where we draw a line through the bar codes and check expiration dates. We unwrap multi-packs of cans. We throw away anything that is expired. We then count the number of food and non-food items so I can report back to you each week. On Tuesday morning, I take the donations to the Coop, make a shopping list and come back to my office to send you the weekly email. That's the whole process. So what is a good donation? Good donations are items that have a shelf life of several weeks. Of course new is best. Sample items like soaps and shampoos are also great. Items in closed containers are best. Oatmeal and grits as individual serving envelopes are great. Please avoid breads and pastries. The Coop gets a huge donation of those items from local stores and ends up throwing most of that away after a couple of days. Other donations for the Coop such as clothes and appliances have their own set of rules. If you want to donate such items, please call me first, and I will help you with that, or just drop those in the local Goodwill. Since we really focus on food and certain other short-term expendables, those are safer. If you have any questions or concerns, please call Steve Perry at 678-717-9818, and remember if we each grab a couple of things as we go through our favorite grocery store, we will have an incredible impact on those less fortunate. Finally, if you have a large number of items, as has happened in the past, give me a call, and I will come and get it so you don't have to pack it to the church on Sunday morning. 


Deeper Life Retreats- Deeper life retreats are an incredible experience, a faith building weekend, a friend making weekend, a God worshipping weekend.

Prayer Beepers – Did you know that LCC has several 'prayer beepers'? When requested, we assign one of the beeper numbers to an LCC member who is ill or needs prayer for a specific reason or time period. Basically, after assignment, we notify the congregation via e-mail with the name, beeper number and prayer request. When you pray for that person, you call the beeper number and it signals them. That way, they know someone just prayed for them. If you would like to receive a prayer beeper or just want more information about them, please contact Paul Bengtson. Many people who have used a prayer beeper in the past found great comfort and encouragement from them (even when they go off in the middle of the night!). Currently, we have 2 prayer beepers out.
