# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

What did Jesus look like? We are curious, aren't we? Drawings, paintings, and movies are relatively in consensus about this. He is tall, slim, has a well-groomed beard, tasteful (but not too ornate) robe, sandals, white skin and usually either brown or dark hair (but usually neither blonde nor black). He sometimes has blue eyes. Of course, reality (He being of middle-eastern Jewish descent) tells us His complexion had to have been much darker, His hair and eyes much darker, and we have no idea about His eye color, or appearance of His robe, etc. Also: He is always handsome. Attractive.

What do we base these notions on? Oddly, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John say little (almost nothing) about His looks or appearance. We have very little info to draw from with contemporary accounts outside of Scripture, either. Could He have been short? Heavy? Dressed in an unkempt manner? We hope not! We want our Savior...attractive.

It's interesting, but the most info we have concerning all of this occurs in Isaiah, written 100's of years before Jesus came on the scene. Isaiah is writing prophetically, of course. Here are some descriptions from his account: people were "appalled at Him." "His appearance was...disfigured." Believe it or not, it says His appearance was such it was like nothing they'd ever seen before: "His appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any human being and his form marred beyond human likeness."(Isaiah 52:14) The prophet goes further: "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to Him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire Him." (53:2) Worse: "Like one from whom people hide their faces He was despised..." (53:3) This is painful to even read, isn't it?

I have no doubt that this description in Isaiah is meant to cover the way Jesus looked before and during and after His crucifixion. Still...

Our Savior was...Ugly. No one came running to Him, wanting to associate with His physical beauty and attractiveness. I have no idea what the pre-incarnate Lord Jesus looked like, and if I did no words could adequately describe His glory and beauty! But He left all that, and "He made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness." (Philippians 2:7) He hung out with people who didn't look so nice themselves: "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?", people wanted to know (Luke 5:30). And the worst thing about me is not my physical appearance (which is certainly not so wonderful itself), but my spiritual nature; there is an ugliness and rudeness and vileness about me that is truly off-putting. And Jesus took that ugliness, my ugliness, upon Himself: "the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:6)

He is an Ugly Savior. And yet...despite that, He is...a Beautiful Savior! The most beautiful sight we have ever seen! I look forward to sharing this story with you during December! I hope you will join us. My love to you and yours—
