MINISTER'S MESSAGE

"LCC: Where Cultures Meet Christ"

Churches like slogans! LCC had them in the past long before I came here. And since I've been here, we've had some more. We had "Reaching the World for Jesus One Heart at a Time." We wore red wristbands with that on them. For a fundraising campaign we had "Rebuilding the Walls." Last year we used "Mission Trip to Lilburn." (I like that one so much we're going to keep saying it and following it!) A few months ago a new one emerged: "LCC: Where Cultures Meet Christ."

Lord willing, this will be our dominant theme for 2016. And here's the Scripture that will fuel its implementation: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.
