MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Joy is all over the place in this world. Everyone seems to have it. Everyone seems to want more of it. Joy is associated with the wine glass: drink, celebrate, find joy. Joy is associated with sports: my team won! Joy.

Do you associate Joy with God? Many don't. God is a...killjoy. If we enjoy something, then, well, He's probably against it. Is that true?

I did a quick search of the Bible looking for "joy", in all of its word forms—joyful, joyous, rejoice, etc.—and came up with, roll the drums...almost 500 references! Later, I ran across a scholar who more carefully tabulated all the Hebrew words (from the Old Testament) associated with joy, and all the Greek words (from the New Testament) associated with joy, and he came up with right around 700! The Bible is literally filled with joy. C.S. Lewis, who before he came to a relationship with God through Christ, was famously an agnostic, a skeptic, a disbeliever, entitled his spiritual autobiography *Surprised By Joy*. With all this joy in the Bible, it should be a surprise if we DON'T find joy! God wants us to have joy.

In fact, it's more than that. I noticed in the Christmas story in both Luke 2 and Matthew 2 expressions about joy that I had not paid adequate attention to before. The Shepherds were told of "great joy" that would be for all the people. And the Wisemen, upon seeing the Star near the Christ child were filled with "great joy." The words in the original language in both cases is, literally, "mega" joy! Big Joy. Enormous Joy. Gigantic Joy. Joy Bigger, Better, Richer, Sweeter, than all the rest! Why, who would settle for mere joy, ordinary joy, regular joy, plain joy—when Great Joy is right here right, now? In a very real sense: Jesus came to bring us Great Joy!

If that's true, and I believe that it is, we need to know what that means. What, exactly, is Great Joy, and how does it differentiate from regular joy? How can I get some of it? Let's talk about it! In January our messages will look at some marvelous Bible passages and look to both define Great Joy and explain how Great Joy can permeate our lives. I've got a lot of this or that; more Joy is always welcome!

Pray for this series and join us in January! Love, and Joy, to all—



In 2001, while serving with another ministry in the city, Pastor Jeony Ordoñez was given the vision to begin working with this incredibly poor population through his five year old daughter. Together they made a trip to the dump on a medical brigade when his daughter asked if there was anything else they could do. God eventually showed him the way. He didn't know originally what God had in mind for him, but he did know he needed to gain the trust of the families working at the dump.

As a population, they are largely ignored. However, that does not prevent visitors from coming to earn sympathy points. Two groups in particular, pastors and politicians, are largely viewed in a negative way by many of the workers. Many have come to make promises that are never implemented. For that reason, Jeony knew that he needed to convince them that he was here for the long haul. Pat Ferguson told us about traditions in other countries such as Italy and Australia to name a few.


A total of 79 toys, games, puzzles and dolls were collected for the Lilburn Co-Op children.



Prayer Beepers – Did you know that LCC has several 'prayer beepers'? When requested, we assign one of the beeper numbers to an LCC member who is ill or needs prayer for a specific reason or time period. Basically, after assignment, we notify the congregation via e-mail with the name, beeper number and prayer request. When you pray for that person, you call the beeper number and it signals them. That way, they know someone just prayed for them. If you would like to receive a prayer beeper or just want more information about them, please contact Paul Bengtson. Many people who have used a prayer beeper in the past found great comfort and encouragement from them (even when they go off in the middle of the night!). Currently, we have 2 prayer beepers out.
