MINISTER'S MESSAGE

GALATIANS 5:1

In school we learned about the Magna Carta. It's a big deal in Great Britain, as big a deal as our Declaration of Independence or Constitution. And, it's a whole lot older. King John of England was seen as a bit of a tyrant by the people, and so the Archbishop of Canterbury drew up a document that he would sign that would be his agreeing to

play well with others. The document granted some freedom for the people—limits on taxes, restrictions against illegal imprisonment, etc.—and King John, perhaps grudgingly, signed it June 15, 1215. The king and others though, weren't quite ready to live by the Magna Carta, and the pact was broken, and, of course, a war broke out! But King John died soon enough, the

document was ratified again in 1297, and even today it retains a powerful status as a symbol of freedom and liberty.

I say all of this because Paul's letter to the Galatians has been called the *Magna Carta of Christian Liberty*! This document came not from King John and an Archbishop, but from God Himself! He wishes us not to live in slavery or bondage or fear—but in the freedom that comes from walking in the love of Christ!

Galatians is filled with great passages that pop off of the page, and my favorite is 5:1, which is an excellent summary of the entire letter: "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." We are free, in Christ! Paul passionately speaks a defense of this freedom,

standing up to whatever opponents might say against it, and however well connected these opponents might be. He seemed to enjoy a tussle, theologically speaking, and Galatians is filled with him fighting for the freedom he is convinced Christ has granted us.

Read Galatians! It is my plan to preach from Galatians this summer. Our key verse, of course, is 5:1, and our overall title, which fits in

with our Church Theme for 2017 (Great Joy) is "The Joy of Living Free"! I look forward to sharing these messages with you.

Pray for our church, and pray for the all of our efforts to spread this Gospel of Christ, which alone can set people truly free! I love and pray for you and your family—



Christian City is an organization that provides vibrant living, life-changing hope and a community of loving friends. Life at Christian City is all about looking forward to a better day and living life to its fullest. There are five programs that "live" on the campus:

- The Children's Village (family-style group homes) for youth who are victims of abuse, abandonment or neglect. Each home is staffed by full-time house parents who provide a nurturing family environment.
- A Safe Place agency: Children in crisis can go to over 70 locations in the metro area if they feel they are in danger. They are on call 24/7 to bring these children to safety at The Children's Village where their staff works with their parents to reunite them.
- <u>An affordable independent living community</u> for adults age 60+ in a serene and convenient location with amenities to encourage a vibrant lifestyle. This includes 287 HUD subsidized apartments for senior citizens and 212 life-lease patio homes.
- <u>A highly-rated health care facility</u> that includes 176 assisted living units and a 200-bed skilled nursing and rehabilitation facility. Memory care and Alzheimer's support units are included.
- An <u>active volunteer program</u> that provides hundreds of opportunities for residents of Christian City and the nearby communities to serve on our campus.





Prayer Beepers – Did you know that LCC has several 'prayer beepers'?
