MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Have you read John 15 lately? The subject is Jesus is the Vine and we are the Branches. It is quite a wonderful arrangement! He talks about our need to "remain" in Him. And when we do, magnificent fruit can be produced! More fruit than we ever dreamed. God is at work "pruning", the painful process of cutting away parts of the plant which, while still alive, hamper further growth and

development. God wants a bumper crop!

I see grapes...succulent, luscious, almost too beautiful to be real. But they are real! Two baskets won't hold them, or 5, or 25. There is more. Still more. The branches themselves keep getting bigger, and their ability to produce more fruit keeps expanding. Everything is alive. This is God's desire for us!

To me the passage reaches a crescendo in V. 11—"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." Well, imagine that! This is crying out to be preached as part of our year-long series on "Great Joy", isn't it? "The Joy Connection", that's it, isn't it? Connected—we bear fruit! If we are dis-connected? If we do not "remain"? Well...


"Nothing grows under a banyan tree" is a proverb from India. Apparently the banyan tree is enormous, it's branches alive and full and huge, the plant forming evergrowing secondary trunks and spreading out.

A full-grown banyan may cover over an acre. Birds, animals, and humans find shelter under its shade. But nothing can grow underneath it. The ground is empty of plant life, looking like a big bare spot; lifeless. On the other hand, in India, there is the banana tree. Small shoots appear on the ground all around it. Later, another cycle of shoots takes root. At 18 months the main trunk produces

fruit which feeds birds, animals, and humans, and then it dies; but the shoots emerge now and there is more growth, and before long there is more fruit...and more fruit...and more

God's fruit is like that. His desire is an endless supply of fruit—and we are the ones, with His help, who can produce it! We are living organisms with, when connected to Him, potential we can only

dream of! Lord, bear fruit in us!

A short course in the Coop. I am reprinting a part of a recent email because there may be people new to the Coop mission or may need a refresher course.

The food ministry of the Coop operates on a family need basis. Families apply in person and once approved, they are given food items based on their needs. They may come to the Coop every other week and must demonstrate their continuing need. These items are taken from the shelves by volunteers at the Coop and designed to supplement that families foods. Most donations are caned items like what one would buy for their family. There are procedures for other donations:

Sugar, flour, rice and detergent often comes in larger bags. Those bags are broken down by volunteers into one pound bags that given to families.

Coffee that comes in larger than one pound bags would be broken down like sugar.

Tea bags and crackers are broken down into small units. A few tea bags or a sleeve of crackers would be given to a family.

Large cans are set aside for large families.

Feminine hygiene products and diapers are broken down and issued individually.

At Thanksgiving and Christmas, special kits are made up to help those less fortunate have a better holiday. At Christmas, this includes toys for the Children.

When you are wondering what to donate, first please don't donate anything that requires refrigeration. Having said that, you have two pretty good sources of inspiration. First is the weekly email I send out. Second is your own family. What would your family like to eat? What would you buy if your refrigeration was extremely limited. Some staples include:

Mac and Cheese

Peanut Butter and Jelly

Canned Meat

Hamburger Helper

Sugar

Flour

Rice

There are many other possibilities. If you are in the store buying food for your family, consider picking up two cans where you would normally grab one. Shop the specials and BOGOs. If every family will grad an extra item or two, we will routinely collect over a hundred items a week.


All LCC ladies are encouraged to attend. It is a great time of spiritual renewal and Christian fellowship.

A little history about Salamanca:

The first settlements in the province of Salamanca are estimated to date back to pre-historical times (1000-2000 b.c.) according to different archeologically findings in the area. Later the province was inhibited by Greeks and Carthaginians who also were the first to build a small village where the town of Salamanca is located today. The name of the town is supposed to have its origin from a famous Greek historian, Salamantica who lived in the town. And Christopher Columbus actually visited the University de Salamanca. The University was founded in 1218 A.D.

A little history about the En Vivo Ministry:

En Vivo is a campus ministry at the University of Salamanca. It hosted its first Thursday night Bible Study in the Spring of 2005. Since then, En Vivo has continued offering the university students of Salamanca a place to connect with God, with others, and with the needs of world around them. Each semester En Vivo serves the Spanish students through activities such as Café Inglés, where the campus house is transformed into a café and students come to practice their English conversation skills. En Vivo also leads group Bible studies, and various social activities. Each semester En Vivo has retreats to destinations outside of Salamanca so students can connect with one another over a long weekend, have fun playing some crazy games, and enjoy learning more about the God who is in love with them so much that He sent His Son to die for them. In 2008 En Vivo hosted its first missions trip as students and staff traveled to Braga, Portugal to build a home with Habitat for Humanity.
