Here are some of the notes I took –

In time of tragedy, we ask where's God? Yet, it takes the adversities in life to trust God in our lives.

Change happens, and we don't like change – even churches change...

Moses had led God's people only so far - then Joshua had some mighty big shoes to fill.

In Joshua, chapter 1, God tells His people to get ready to cross the Jordan River, so they broke camp.

Sometimes, we need to be willing to let go of the past and embrace the future.

Where was God? He was right there, ready to do something amazing.

Sometimes, God wants to do something so BIG, so that we could not even attempt to take credit for it.

In Joshua, chapter 3, we read that the Jordan River was at flood stage. Once the priests stepped into the water,

God stopped the water from flowing way upstream and it piled up miles away.

Sometimes, God works upstream and out of sight...

Do we let our circumstances paralyze us?

Remember, the leaders had to walk in faith and get their ankles wet..

Point 1: Take a step of faith (the very circumstance you think will swallow you up will become your greatest victory). A journey that should have taken them a few days took 40 years!

Point 2: Trust what you cannot see (God is always working upstream in our lives). Hebrews 11:1 says "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

Point 3: Let go of what you cannot control. Get out of God's way.

Point 4: Trust God's timing. Isaiah 40: 31 says "Yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles. They will run and not get tired. They will walk and not become weary."










































Cafe Five Fifty

Prayer Beepers – Did you know that LCC has several 'prayer beepers'? When requested, we assign one of the beeper numbers to an LCC member who is ill or needs prayer for a specific reason or time period. Basically, after assignment, we notify the congregation via email with the name, beeper number and prayer request. When you pray for that person, you call the beeper number and it signals them. That way, they know someone just prayed for them. If you would like to receive a prayer beeper or just want more information about them, please contact Paul Bengtson. Many people who have used a prayer beeper in the past found great comfort and encouragement from them (even when they go off in the middle of the night!). Currently, we have no prayer beepers out.
