We Give

"The Church is the only organization on earth that exists for the benefit of outsiders." I've heard this said before. Is it true? Well, we have the Red Cross. And The American Cancer Society. And others. So perhaps there are other altruistic organizations out there. And some people within the Church would

also contest this notion. Sometimes we, inside the Church, think that the Church exists to meet our own needs! And, truthfully, I find many needs of mine met at Church (for friendships, for affirmation, for receiving love, and many more.)

Still, the Church IS all about others. We never have enough here, There is always room for more. We



The first week of October, a new family that will be training with the Johnson family-the Fosters arrived on one-way tickets. They'll spend the next 3 months with the Johnson family in Guatemala, then relocate to Honduras early next year. The next 90 days in Guatemala will include an intense missionary training program, 3 hours per day of language school, and lots of rhino Futbol for their 2 boys!

Their boys are the exact same ages as Brock and & Kerrie's kids were when they arrived in the mission field in 2008. Jake had just turned 7, Brooke was 10, and Madi was 11. In the foster's case, Jackson is 7 and Alek is 10.

Jackson has had a couple tough moments since getting here last week. nothing crazy, just normal stuff. It's not easy on a kid to leave his friends and family, switch culture's overnight, and have his world turned completely upside down. Brock noted that his kids were the same age when they moved to Guatemala and difficult it can be moving to the mission field!

Please pray for the Johnson family and also the Jackson family as they work together training, learning and preparing to share God's word in Guatemala and Honduras.












I wish everyone could have been upstairs with the 3 young people who were baptized this past Sunday.

Prayer Beepers:



Prayer Beepers – Did you know that LCC has several 'prayer beepers'? When requested, we assign one of the beeper numbers to an LCC member who is ill or needs prayer for a specific reason or time period. Basically, after assignment, we notify the congregation via email with the name, beeper number and prayer request. When you pray for that person, you call the beeper number and it signals them. That way, they know someone just prayed for them. If you would like to receive a prayer beeper or just want more information about them, please contact Paul Bengtson. Many people who have used a prayer beeper in the past found great comfort and encouragement from them (even when they go off in the middle of the night!). Currently, we have no prayer beepers out.
