# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

Bread is a big deal in the Gospels. We run into 2 kinds of bread as we read Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, actually. There is, of course, the kind we are most familiar with, made of grain and made to be eaten. This kind of bread nourishes, it sustains. The "Staff of Life" it is sometimes called. The smell of freshly baked bread...can you resist that? It's hard for me to do so.

But there is another kind of bread. This kind is also made to be eaten, but not physically. It also nourishes and sustains—in fact, one cannot live without it! It is not made of grain. Jesus identified Himself with this 2<sup>nd</sup> type of bread: "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry."(John 6:35) Jesus referred to the manna with which God fed the Israelites in their wilderness wanderings, and said, in effect, "He is doing it again! He is feeding you. Only not physically, but spiritually!" He said that His flesh was the real food. His body broken for us feeds us as bread broken can then be eaten, consumed. We consume this spiritual bread by faith when we trust Christ!


All 4 Gospels record the Feeding of the 5000. Jesus takes bread, breaks it, distributes it...and miraculously a few loaves feeds a big crowd! Important to be sure, but He was after a Bigger Meal: the meal of people seeing in Him the Master of True Bread Production! He can *FEED* us in the way we truly need to be fed! In the Gospels we read of the Lord's Supper. "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take and eat; this is my body.""(Matthew 26:26)

I think that, as a Church, Jesus wants us to feed others with BOTH kinds of bread! Grain-bread, so they can live; the Bread of Life so they can Live! Don't you?

We'll be studying the multiplied bread and the 5000 in March. We'll also study the Good Samaritan. In that story, we find we've got a whole lot of neighbors needing us to be...neighborly. So, we're going to feed some people in March! **March 23—a Free Lunch!** We're going to try to raise \$1,000. And then assemble 300 Free Lunches on that day. We will...give them away! And then we'll tell them about the Bread of Life while we give them grain-bread. We'll give them brochures about our church where they can learn how they can come and hear more about Jesus, the Living Bread!

I think Jesus wants us to do this. See you in March-

Leprosy is a disease that attacks and causes progressive and permanent damage to skin, nerves, limbs, and eyes. Lepers are often forced out of their homes. CRAM Worldwide is now ministering among a leper colony in Stung Treng, Cambodia to care for the physical and spiritual needs of the sick. They are building ten houses for twenty leper families so they may have a safe and loving place to call home.



They also began construction on a medical facility in partnership with Fellowship of Associates of Medical Evangelism (FAME). Their hope is to one day build a church for the lepers. Since Cambodia is a religiously free country, they are able to share the Gospel openly.

### Attention All Ladies (or anyone interested in a fun craft project)

You are invited to a 'Christmas in July' event.



#### We are really excited to announce our date for 'Christmas in July'!!

Several ladies from LCC learned how to make No-Sew Folded Fabric Ornaments a few years ago, and we want to share this process with you on <u>Saturday</u>, July 20<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm in the Family Life <u>Center</u>.

If you have not purchased your material, there is still plenty of time. We wanted to give you <u>advanced notice</u> so you can shop for fabrics you would like to use. You can watch for coupons and sales or go to Fabric World in Snellville.

These no-sew Folded Fabric Ornaments are really easy to make and do not have to be Christmas colors or fabric. Think fall colors, beach colors, your favorite sports team colors, pastels for Spring/Easter or patriotic (red, white and blue)...

By publishing this event for the past several months, we have given you time to plan ahead and find some amazing fabric. You still have time to find great fabric for the **next 5 months.** We still have some of your favorite holidays coming up (St. Patrick's Day, Easter, Fourth of July....).

#### Materials (per ornament – in case you want to make more than one):

- Polystyrene/Styrofoam ball (7 inch circumference, approx. 3 inch in height)
- •3 or 4 coordinated fabrics dark, medium, and light hues work well
  - •Select cotton blends
  - •¼ yard of each color or you can buy fat quarters
  - •Small prints work best (although solid colors work, too)
- Dressmaker pins (these have small, flat heads available at Walmart)
- •Ribbon (½ inch width)
- •Note: if you would rather use a strip of material to finish off your ornament instead of ribbon, you will need a strip of material approximately 3 inches by 10 inches.

If you want to cut your fabric in advance, you are welcome to do that.

- •They are 3 inch squares
- •You will need 8 of one color/fabric
- You will need 16 each of your other colors/fabric

If you do not want to cut your fabric in advance (or need help doing it), we will have all of the other supplies you will need to cut your fabric that day (rotary cutter, straight edge, scissors, etc..)

If this is the first time you have seen this article and want to use Christmas material, let us know. I'm sure others have fabric they are willing to share!
