MINISTER'S MESSAGE

What's the best conversion story you've ever heard? Along the way we've all heard of someone who used to be heavily into substance abuse but now they've been clean and sober for 12 years. Or maybe they used to take things, or hurt people, and now they have become a giver or helper to people. Such stories can inspire us.

Seems like years ago at church, or at camps, or retreats, one would hear "testimonies", where someone would speak to the crowd and explain how once they'd been struggling, or living a selfish life hurtful to others, but now Christ had their attention and had changed them, and they were living for Jesus. Sometimes these stories could be very dramatic and involve a crisis or near-tragedy. Such stories can help us be reminded that the Lord really is mighty to save! Maybe we need to get back to doing more of such testimonies?


The Scriptures themselves are loaded with stories of life-transformation. Moses goes from a stuttering, low self-confidence, on-the-run-from murder kind of a guy to God's Law giver and leader. Rahab was a prostitute, who became an icon of faith in God. In the Gospels we see the demon-possessed set free, doubters become believers, and even a dying thief come to faith. But it is in the book of Acts that we find conversion accounts explode off of the pages of Scripture the most!

Check out Acts! We plan to read through it and preach through it in May. There, we see the Gospel, the story of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, presented by unlikely people (Peter, former denier; Saul/Paul, former arch-enemy of Christ) with truly extraordinary results (1000's of converts, many very unexpected, whole cities put into uproar, etc.) These conversion stories not only tell us clearly how we can become Christians ourselves, but they inspire us, reminding us afresh of God's incredible power to change lives!

"The Acts of the Apostles" is the official name of this book. And, it's not a bad name. Perhaps a better name, though, would be "The Acts of God's Holy Spirit in the Lives of the People He is Changing"! I hope that my conversion story, and yours (and those of the loved ones you are praying for) will be listed among God's great works of conversion!




We are asking you to pick up any of these generic school supplies during the months of May and June.

This year is flying by! 'Christmas in July' will be here soon!!

Several ladies from LCC learned how to make No-Sew Folded Fabric Ornaments a few years ago and we want to share this process with you on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>July 20th from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm in the Family Life Center</u>

These no-sew Folded Fabric Ornaments are really easy to make and do not have to be Christmas colors or fabric. Spring/Easter fabrics are on sale. Patriotic prints in red, white and blue are available, as well...

If this is the first time you have seen this article and want to use Christmas material, or if you need some fabric to coordinate with yours, let us know.

If you have some fabric you want to share, please bring it with you.

Materials (per ornament – in case you want to make more than one):

- Polystyrene/Styrofoam ball (7 inch circumference, approx. 3 inch in height)
- •3 or 4 coordinated fabrics dark, medium, and light hues work well
 - Select cotton blends
 - •¼ yard of each color or you can buy fat quarters
 - •Small prints work best (although solid colors work, too)
- Dressmaker pins (these have small, flat heads available at Walmart)
- Ribbon (½ inch width)
 - •Note: if you would rather use a strip of material to finish off your ornament instead of ribbon, you will need a strip of material approximately 3 inches by 10 inches.

If you want to cut your fabric in advance, you are welcome to do that:

- •They are 3 inch squares
- You will need 8 of one color/fabric
- •You will need 16 each of your other colors/fabric

If you do not want to cut your fabric in advance (or need help doing it), we will have all of the other supplies you will need to cut your fabric that day (rotary cutter, straight edge, scissors, etc..)
