## **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

I remember reading about one old preacher who, at the end of his career, was asked what he would do differently this time. He said, "If I knew I had only three years left to preach, I'd spend the first two of them studying and preparing"! Rigorous study is needed to preach, for sure. But the Christian life itself is a life of study! We are all called to be "scholars", in some sense. We all must learn to become students of the Word. We don't merely learn a little bit at the beginning—get a couple of questions answered, find a nice Bible passage or two—and then put the Book on the shelf! Nor do we trust others to do our studying for us!

How could we? God's Word itself is often likened to food. Food that nourishes and sustains. "Man does not live by bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God", Jesus said. (Matt. 4:4) The Scriptures become for us "sweeter than honey" (Psalm 19:10), and the prophets warned of a time when there would be "a famine of hearing the words of the Lord" (Amos 8:11). All of us must eat! And we must feed regularly on a balanced diet of the Word. Here is our calling, preacher or not: "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15).

No one ever reminds me to eat a meal! I have an excellent appetite. Sometimes I wish I could turn down the volume on it a couple of notches! As a kid, there weren't nearly as many restaurants, fastfood or not, around as there are today. Two burger joints I remember as a boy in the 1960's were Krystals and McDonalds. There were only one or two of each in Atlanta at the time. Krystals was my favorite. hamburgers were 10 cents! McDonalds soon outdid Krystals. As McDonalds popped up, they would adjust their signs: "1 Million served", "10 Million served", and so on. Soon: "Billions served"! I wonder if anyone checked that, or they just put the numbers up as they wished? Today there are (allegedly) 38,000 McDonald's franchises in the world, in 120 countries! As an older guy now, I seldom eat at McDonalds any more (though someone gave me a tip: you can get a Senior's coffee for only 75 cents!), I prefer at least some semblance of good nutrition in my meals!

Spiritually, too, I hope my "diet" has improved. I hope you join me in that! "Your words are so choice, so tasty; I prefer them to the best home cooking" (Psalm 119:103, The Message).

#### **Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow!**

When the Wholesale School Supplies Warehouse in Lilburn contacted the church office in June to see if we were interested in buying some school supplies at a discounted price, we had no idea what a huge blessing it would turn out to be! After we purchased some often-requested items, the owner offered us large amounts of certain items free of charge! God opened the door. We just had to walk through it and follow His lead.

We have had the privilege of sorting and donating over \$138,000 worth of school supplies (based on back-to-school prices) during the month of July. What a huge God given blessing and honor is has been to be part of that whole process. Originally, we had 24 people who helped pick up truckloads of the donated items from the warehouse and unload it in the FLC. Plus, we had 22 people work steadily to get everything organized and distributed to 34 schools (both local and out of state), as well as several of our local missions. We are also including some school supplies items with our Operation Christmas Child boxes this year.

As part of this outreach, we included a note that said: "These school supplies were donated through a local warehouse. Lilburn Christian Church wants to share our blessing with our local community and give absolute praise to Jesus Christ."

Hopefully, this will be an open door to those who received the donations.
