MINISTER'S MESSAGE

We have been going through a series "Why are We Here?" Perhaps the best way to answer this question is to put it succinctly: go, go, go, go! In fact, this has effectively become a slogan for us. I hear many of you repeating it, which is fantastic! The slogan developed out of the first sermon in our series which focused upon the Great Commission: "Go and make disciples of all the nations" (Matt. 28:19). This is our primary task; it is LCC's mission. But how do we accomplish this?

The message for July 9th will be looking specifically at "How Do We Accomplish Our Mission?" We accomplish it through evangelism, edification, and education (or e³ for short). These three elements we can call our *values*. We at LCC value spreading the Gospel, building up stronger disciples, and getting to know God more deeply. The message will explore the details of these values. I hope you will be able to glean from this message and be better equipped to fulfill LCC's mission.

Finally, on July 16th, the message will focus upon LCC's newly revised vision statement: "To love and serve our community, bringing it to the knowledge of God, a saving relationship with Jesus Christ, and communion in the Holy Spirit." As you can observe, the vision is centered around the triune God we

worship: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each person of the Trinity plays a different role in our salvation and discipleship. As such, we want to make sure that, as we carry out our mission to spread the Gospel, we communicate and guide unbelievers into a relationship with our trinitarian God, the Creator of all things.

Of course, the first part of LCC's vision statement is just as important: "to love and serve our community." This echoes the "go, go, go, go!" slogan. We want to go and love and serve everyone in our community, no matter the nationality, language, or tribe! This means literally *everyone*, no strings attached.

Soon, we will be celebrating Independence Day, the day Americans became politically free. Let us remember, however, the more important type of freedom that we are to bring to those around us: spiritual freedom from sin and death. This is our mission, it is included in our vision, and it underlies LCC's values. Many in our community have come from other nations seeking freedom in this world, but let's give them something more: spiritual freedom! Let's go, go, go, go!

Lastly please pray for the four year daughter of a fellow worker Rajesh of the mission who helps drive the missions vehicles. She was invited into a neighbor's house by offering her chocolate, and the twenty year old raped her. We didn't call out the mission specifically, but God knows who they are. Please pray for them during this difficult time. We removed their infromation from our website also for their safety.




