# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

#### Church Family,

"And the worst of the worst, the most hated and cursed, is the one that we call Scrooge." So goes the introductory song to one of my favorite Christmas movies "The Muppets Christmas Carol". Scrooge, as we know, was the old greedy miser from Charles Dicken's famous narrative *A Christmas Carol*. Everyone despised him because of his unthankful, greedy heart and contrary disposition to all that was good, including the celebration of Christmas.

By the end of the prose, however, we find that Scrooge had been changed. He had been visited by three ghosts that showed him his past, present, and future. What they showed him was disturbing to him: his true nature, everyone's view of him, and the resulting catastrophes brought about by his ungrateful, uncaring ways. Three ghosts, all in a one night's visit, converted him to be thankful, empathetic, and celebrate Christmas.

Dickens' story, and much more the Muppets interpretation of it, is a great novel that provides good lessons (and some laughter). There is, however, something missing from the story. What was it exactly that made Scrooge change his mind? Was it his own inner strength? The awareness of his faults? Did the ghosts wield some unseen power that convicted him? The story of Scrooge, although a classic, leaves much to the imagination of exactly what brought about his transformation.

In a society that values and prizes the emotional, the sentimental, and psychological well-being, *A Christmas Carol* is a powerful illustration of "becoming a better you": you just need to "see more clearly who you really are" and

then "pull yourself up by the bootstraps" to make yourself better and likable. Only then will life be better for you, and you will be more happy.

By contrast, the biblical story of Christmas is much more significant and powerful. It is about God (specifically, the second person of the Trinity, the Son of God) becoming incarnate in the man Jesus of Nazareth. Just think of this: God becomes a man! More powerfully, he becomes a man to save all of humanity from its sins and re-establish a relationship with himself. Jesus, the God-man, loves his creation to the extent to die a brutal death on a cross and suffer the penalty for *our* sins, we wretched sinners who are powerless and have nothing good in us. Then, in great triumph, Jesus rises from the dead by his own power. Now, transformation of our miserly and contrary dispositions is accomplished, not by us, but God himself!

This is a story to write a Christmas carol about! This is a story in which true conversion occurs. No matter how much willpower we wield, how many ghosts may visit, or how much awareness we have of our faults, we will never be able to repair our crooked ways. It is only the power of God who can transform us, and this was made possible by the coming of Jesus two-thousand years ago in a feeding trough. This is the Christmas Carol of conversion to be told!
