# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

Church Family,

"Redo!" This is what kids say a lot when they do not like how things are going in a game. I recall many years ago when a friend of mine kept claiming a "redo" every time he didn't make a point in a game we were playing. "Redo, redo, redo." It was like a mantra with him, and it was certainly unfair. His "redo's" effectively guaranteed he would win the game. This was not exactly just, and it was no way to play a game! A game is supposed to be competitive, and may the best man win!

Life is quite different than a game. There are no redo's. If you make an error in how much money is in your account and overdraw it, you get penalized. If you do not pay your bills on time, you receive late fees or your utilities get turned off. If you don't pay your rent, you get evicted. There are no redo's in life to guarantee a positive outcome.

As we face yet another end of a year and a new one on its way, we often want a re-do or multiple ones. We look back over the previous year and often think, "Wow. That was not a good choice. I wish I would have chosen differently in that situation!" As we ponder our past, we have regrets. Some are bigger than others, but the fact remains that we wish we could do it all over again, but correctly.

There is, however, good news! We may not be able to have any redo's (what is done is indeed *done*), but we can have all our regrets, guilt, and sins removed! This is the primary messages of the Gospel: Jesus came to die on a Roman cross for our sins and conquer death through being raised from the dead. If we believe and trust in Jesus and his work he did on our behalf, our regrets, guilt, and sins are all forgiven. We receive a clean slate, a righteousness that is not our own but Christ's.

This is better than a redo! This is renewal—a *recreation*. A redo would simply be attempting to go back to a situation to make a sinless choice with the hope of a better outcome. Being recreated, on the other hand, is forgiveness for our past sinful choices *and* our future ones. It is the putting to death of the old self and God making a new one who is empowered to live for Him. It is a promise of eternal life with Jesus! A redo would leave our guilt, regrets, and sin while recreation removes all of it. Moreover, because recreation is based upon the grace of God, we actually receive the very opposite of what we deserve.

As I think about it, I don't want any redo's. God's salvation is so much better. We can leave our regrets, sin, and guilt behind us. Christ took it all for us. As we face the coming of a new year, put your hand to the plow and don't look back. Keep your eyes on Jesus!
