# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

Church Family,

"Love is love." This has become a very popular slogan in our culture. Exactly what it means is left to the imagination. It is the same as saying "red is red" or "Peter is Peter." It just states the obvious and thus leaves us with wondering what we are specifically talking about. Thankfully, when it comes to the Christian worldview, we do not have to wonder what love truly is or how it is defined. This month in which we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, love is not only defined but exemplified clearly through the words and actions of our Savior as an agape, or self-sacrificing, kind of love.

In the final week of Jesus' life, known as the Passion week, we see Jesus showing repeatedly his disciples the meaning of love. In the upper room as the Passover Feast was about to begin, Jesus washed his disciples' feet, something only a servant would do. During the meal, Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper with powerful words of love: "This is my body which is given for you. . . . This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (Luke 22:19, 20; NASB). Jesus then teaches his disciples a very important lesson about what love looks like: "The one who is the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like the servant" (Luke 22:26). Jesus then turns to Peter and prophesies that he will deny him three times but encourages him that he will still love him, saying that Peter ought to strengthen the other disciples once he repents (Luke 22:31).

Even later in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus shows what true love is when he prays not only for his disciples but for those who will believe in him because of them (John 17:20). At every turn during the Passion week, Jesus shows that true love is agape: unconditional, self-sacrificing, and outward focus toward others. The Passion week, as we know, culminates in the most dramatic, exemplary act and display of love in human history. Jesus, God in the flesh, lays down his life and is crucified for the sins of the world. He takes the penalty reserved for sinners, which he was not. He becomes our substitutionary atonement. But the story and display of love did not end there. Jesus is raised from the dead on the third day, conquering death and all that is evil. Love triumphed even over the grave!

This is what love truly is. Love seeks the good of others. It is laying down one's life to fulfill what is the best good for others. As the Apostle Paul would go on to say in his letter to the Corinthians: love is patient, love is kind, and it is not jealous. It does not brag, it is not arrogant, it does not seek its own. "Love never fails" (1 Cor. 13:8). The cultural slogan "love is love" is empty, but the love as defined by the words and actions of Jesus are rich with meaning. It is the salvation of mankind!

"In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins."  $\sim$ 1 John 4:10 (NASB)


