# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

Church Family,

"Destroyed!" "Crushed!" "Dismantled!" "Wrecked!" The social media reels and headlines are filled with such language, promising to show us how one's opponent is defeated while the victor stands with his foot against the loser's chin, spitting on him lying on the ground (metaphorically speaking, of course). Click the bait. See your side win. Another boxing round goes your way.

Such promises, however, are typically exaggerated. Videos and reels like these consistently show people just yelling at each other, calling names, and using profanity. Not much rational thought or arguments are given, and certainly there are no sober spirits present. Just out of control people fuming and foaming at the mouth.

They remind me of what Paul wrote to Timothy: "But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come. For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good, treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power" (2 Tim. 3:1-5a; NASB). That pretty much summarizes most of YouTube.

What is it that draws us to watch these social media outbursts? I found myself just the other day watching one. Sure, once I caught myself, I knew it was a waste of time and was a bad influence upon my psyche. But there was something that drew me in. There was something about seeing "my side" win.

But did "my side" really win? No. Not at all. In fact, the opposite side won—the side of darkness and the forces of Satan. The fallen world won. The nonrational, emotionally driven outburst of anger modeled the sinful flesh, not the Spirit. It invaded my thoughts and distorted them to be more like an unsaved mind. It taught me how to be more self-loving and prideful. It illustrated how to exert power over others and how to hate them. It gave a perfect picture of how to treat someone less than human and less than the image of God.

So what should we do? The Apostle Paul concluded the above passage of 2 Tim. 3:5, saying, "Avoid such men as these." In short, we ought to avoid these poor examples of how to live and interact with others. Just their little bit of leaven spreads throughout an entire batch of dough and corrupts our minds. We need to set good examples in front of us and think about these things. Paul reminded the Philippians, "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things" (Philip. 4:8).

Did you catch that? *Dwell on these things*. "Dwell" carries with it the idea of reasoning and thinking—to live and contemplate upon. The Lord wants us to reason upon what is good, pure, and holy. There is not much of this on social media. Maybe it's time I eulogize YouTube. Maybe this will bring me one step closer to being more like Jesus.


