MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Church Family,

Recently, I was at home alone when I heard a knock on the door. When I answered it, I saw two very young teenagers staring at me, appearing somewhat petrified. They were nicely dressed as if returning from a church service. One of them asked me, "Can I share with you some words of encouragement from the Bible?" "Sure!" I responded.

With a somewhat shaky voice (I could tell she was new at this and somewhat nervous), she read a verse from the book of Psalms or Isaiah. I honestly do not recall the specific verse, but it had something to with inheriting the earth in some general way.

After reciting the passage, she closed the book and asked, "Wouldn't it be wonderful to live forever on this earth?"

I thought for a moment. Honestly, I didn't think it would be that great. In a flash of a moment, I thought about the sin, destruction, and all the effects from the Fall that this world suffers: my body aches most days, illness and pestilence run rampant frequently around the world, starvation, poverty, disease, war, murder, theft, and on and on occur consistently. That didn't sound wonderful to me. I think I'd rather live in a different place, say, heaven where there will no longer be death, mourning, crying, or pain (Rev. 21:4).

I didn't respond, however, with what I was thinking. Instead, I returned her question with a question of my own: "You two are Jehovah's Witnesses, aren't you?"

Looking somewhat surprised and sheepish, they responded, "Yes. We would like to share more with you if you'd like."

I declined for the moment (I was in the middle of something and had a meeting to go to), but I invited them back for a future discussion. They conceded, we exchanged pleasantries, and off they went down the road.

The question echoed in my head: "Do you want to live on this earth forever?" The Jehovah's Witnesses, taking the Old Testament prophecies given to Israel and applying them to themselves, teach that those who follow their religion will live on this earth forever.

Thankfully, this is not what the Scriptures actually teach. Rather, Christians are promised they will live in a new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells (2 Pet. 3:13). The present heavens "will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat." The earth itself "will be burned up" (2 Pet. 3:10). Jesus will proclaim, "Behold, I am making all things new!" (Rev. 21:5) and the "former things will have passed away" (Rev. 21:4). And best of all: God will dwell with us, his people (Rev. 21:3).

Talk about glorious! I cannot wait! I don't want to live on this present earth forever when God promises so much more. C.S. Lewis, in his book The Weight of Glory, wrote, "If we consider the unblushing promises of reward and the staggering nature of the rewards promised in the Gospels, it would seem that Our Lord finds our desires not too strong, but too weak. We are far too easily pleased." Don't be fooled by cheap imitations of God's promises. God promises much more than we could ever imagine. Don't settle for this world: embrace the hope for the one God has promised us—one without sin, death, and decay. This is where we are headed. Sola Dei Gloria!



They offer a Children's Village that provides out of home care for children ages 5-17 in crisis, Thrive Transitional Living provides housing, supportive services, life-skills education, and appropriate supervision for youth 18-24 who are aging out of the foster care system or who are homeless. They also offer "Safe Place" which is part of a national network for runaway or homeless youth. They respond 24/7 to pick up youth, provide shelter, lover and try to help them figure out what next steps are in their lives.

They also offer adoption and foster care. Christian City has "Healthy Families" which provides a variety of support for working families facing a crisis. Lastly they offer senior living. There are many ways to get involved if your interested either by volunteering donated items for their Graceland Thrift Store, working as a Tutor, becoming a host family etc.

Christian City is a local 500- acre mission located fifteen minutes south of Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport. Please pray for this important ministry for the month of June!

Georgia- O'Keeffe, A Life Well Lived


