MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Have you ever been told to "think outside the box?" Perhaps you were challenged to do this by your boss or manager to solve a problem at work. Maybe you were challenged to do this when attempting to fix an issue with your house. Not too long ago, the handle on my front door was stuck and would not allow anyone to open the door. I dismantled the entire knob, looking for the reason for its malfunction. After failing to find the issue, I finally decided to sit back, take a deep breath, and "think outside the box." Lo and behold, I was able to figure out what was wrong with it. To my surprise, I fixed it!

Living as a Christian can be somewhat similar: we have to think outside the box. Growing up in a secular culture, it is easy to just accept how society thinks and lives. We are like fish who are unaware that they are surrounded by water. Then we begin to have problems because we are living just like our culture (living like a secularist always brings problems). Like my door handle, we often try to fix our problems by using the same tools and methods as the secular society. We often continue trying to fix our problems repeatedly by using the exact same methods we have tried previously. Of course, the problems remain.

To fix the problems, we need to step back, take a deep breath, and think outside the secular box. The first action to take is to step back and analyze the situation. Ask yourself if you are approaching the problem from a Christian perspective. Would a Christian act like this? Would a Christian say this? If not, take a deep breath and acknowledge that a change of direction is needed. Then, think outside the secular box. That is, discern or look for how Christ (not secularism) would want you to approach the problem.

What might thinking outside the secular box look like? As an example, let's say you have difficulty with anger. Your typical approach to resolving your problematic temper has been to "try to do better and top it." This does not sound too bad, but if we think more deeply, we will realize that this is not a Christian approach to resolving the issue. It's a salvation by works method to fix your temper.

"How?" you may ask. Let's step back and analyze it for a moment. Telling yourself to do better is another way of saying, "Thou shall not lose your temper." That is an attempt to do what is right by giving yourself a command. It is an expectation to follow a law. That neither fixes

anything nor calls for any proactive measures to be taken. The Christian view says that the law was not given to make us better, but to point out our sin (Gal 3:19; Heb. 10:1-2). It does not solve anything.

Now we take a deep breath. We realize that the approach of "trying to stop" is not the way to fix the problem. Now what? We must take a new approach. Think outside the box! We need to discern or look for what Christ and his Word teach us about overcoming anger. And what does it say?

Galatians 5:19-24 contrasts numerous sins with fruit of the Spirit. One of the sins listed is "outbursts of anger," so we are in the right place to find an answer! Paul tells us that Christians are to be led by the Spirit, not the flesh. In the same text, he delineates the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. What's the point? The grace-filled way to overcome anger is, first of all, to be in grace (not the law). Once in grace, we have the Holy Spirit who gives us power to overcome the sin of anger. And we can do this by practicing (and praying for) patience, gentleness, and self-control. In short, we overcome losing our temper not by just saying we need to stop it and work on it, but by putting into practice patience, gentleness, and self-control. Rather than smacking yourself and saying, "Don't!" encourage yourself by saying, "Love your neighbor. Be patient, gentle, and selfcontrolled," and put them into practice.

Certainly, thinking outside the box can be difficult. It is especially difficult because it runs contrary to our nature and society. Thankfully, we have the Holy Spirit to guide us in this endeavor. May we all think outside the box!














As I think about how blessed our church is to have people who are willing to get involved, I am so thankful for my youth leaders.




The end of the year is approaching fast! Lots of stuff going on, and I hope you participate in some of the activities on campus.


Abide, for young adults on Wednesday nights, has recently finished the study of "Can I Trust the Bible". What a great series to learn how our Bible came together.


