MINISTER'S MESSAGE

When studying who God is, theologians often discuss the four "O's" of His nature: omnipotence, omniscience, omnipresence, and omnibenevolence. The key to understanding these easily is, first, to break the words down into their parts.

"Omnipotence" comes from omni (meaning "all") and potent (meaning "powerful"). In short, then, when we say God is omnipotent, it means he is all powerful. Similarly, omniscience comes from omni and scientia (meaning "knowledge"). As such, we say God has all knowledge. The other two attributes of God are now much easier to grasp. When we say God is omnipresent and omnibenevolent, it means that God is all/everywhere present and all loving.

The Bible speaks about these four "O's" of God throughout its entirety. For example, Psalm 62:11 says, "Once God has spoken; Twice I have heard this: That power belongs to God" (NASB). If you think about it, God's power is (indeed) all powerful. He created everything by merely speaking—and from nothing! There was no pre-existing stuff that God worked with like a potter does with clay.

In regard to God's knowledge, Scripture proclaims, "Great is our Lord and abundant in strength; His understanding is infinite" (Ps 147:5). His knowledge is so great that he "[declares] the end from the beginning" (Isa 46:10). God's knowledge is so immense that he even knows the future! Romans 8:29 declares, "For those whom He foreknew [knew beforehand], He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren." God's knowledge truly encompasses everything.

Then there is God's omnipresence and omnibenevolence. David wrote, "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? If I ascend to heaven, You are there;

If I make my bed in Sheol, behold, You are there" (Ps 139:7-8). You cannot go anywhere in the universe where God is not. And the love God is comprehensive. In fact, the Bible says, "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8, 16).

What a magnificent, mighty, awesome God we worship! There is no God like our God, as one older song says. Because of whom God is, we ought to praise and extol his name! We can also take comfort in Him when we face obstacles and trials in this life. He has the power and the knowledge to help us in any way we need. Better yet, he knows the best way to answer our prayers!

We can also take comfort in the fact that he is always with us. Because God is omnipresent, we can "contact" him in our car, home, workplace . . . anywhere. In fact, we could probably do better in recognizing this fact as we live our daily lives. Remember that the Lord is "a shelter right by your side" (Ps 121:5: HCSB).

And best of all, God loves us in a way that far exceeds any kind of love anyone else could possibly have for us. God created each one of us. Why? For Himself to love. God looks over and cares for each one of us. Why? Because he loves us. God gives us good gifts, like family, jobs, and beautiful sunsets. Why? Because he loves us. God the Father sent Jesus to die and be resurrected. Why? For us! Because he loves us! The next time you face a doubt or trial, remember the four "O's" of God. He has the power, knowledge, and love to help you. But do not forget the four "O's" during times of joy and satisfaction. He is the omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent, and omnibenevolent God who gave those good gifts to you!







