# **MINISTER'S MESSAGE**

It's difficult to believe that I have been serving as the Senior Minister of Lilburn Christian Church for two years! How time flies! My passion and love for the ministry and the church has only grown since I've been here, and I am looking forward to what God has in store for us in the future. It has been a good experience traveling the road of life with you!

As I continue my ministry alongside you, the primary objective, or goal, remains the same: make disciples. As we have learned in a variety of venues (sermon series, Wednesday studies, and home groups), a disciple is a learner, a student, an apprentice. This learning takes place in two primary ways: in learning the truths of the faith once for all delivered to the saints (Jude 3) and in learning how to live as Christ. In other words, a disciple is a student of mind and action.

That a disciple of Jesus is a student of mind and action is seen throughout all of Scripture. The Apostle Paul states it well in Romans 12:1-2 (NASB):

"Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Notice what Paul says first: we are to present our bodies as "a living and holy sacrifice". This is a command for us to live our lives selflessly for the Lord. Do we put Jesus first? Do we sacrifice ourselves for the Lord every day?

The second main command is to "be transformed by the renewing of your mind". This is a clear statement that we are to be studying and filling our minds with the knowledge of God and his will. Are we doing this?

The eldership is committed to equipping the disciples of LCC to live their lives as a holy sacrifice and to renewing their minds. We consistently and feverishly provide opportunities to study God's Word and to serve our community and one another. We provide, and will provide more, opportunities to practice spiritual disciplines to strengthen our faith and relationship with Christ. We provide and will continue to provide more opportunities for gaining knowledge.

But here is an important question for all of us: are you going to take advantage of these opportunities? We need to recommit ourselves daily to being a disciple of Jesus. This is not really a question of "how much more will you do?" It is the question, "Do you really love Jesus?"

Recall James 2:26: "For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead." If we have genuine belief, trust, and confidence in Jesus Christ, then we ought to have a desire to get to know and act like him better. This leads naturally to taking advantage of studying God's word, service activities with the church, and the fruit of the Spirit. If you do not have the desire for these things and no works to show for it, then perhaps you may want to ask yourself if you really have faith.

As a test to see where you are presently as a disciple, ask yourself a few questions. "If I had the choice between studying God's Word and playing music, what would I do?" "If I had the choice between serving and helping someone in need and playing golf, what would I choose?" "If I had the opportunity to gain knowledge of God's will but it was lunch time, which would I do?" Answers to such questions should shed light on areas we can work on in our discipleship for the Lord. May we all grow in the grace and knowledge of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ!

Sunday, July 27th - The "Call Time" is 3:30pm for the revival at Antioch Christian Church in Watkinsville. More details will come later.


Thank you to our all choir & orchestra members who faithfully lead us in worship each Sunday and diligently rehearse Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings.



Some need C... Compassion.


Some need D... Direction.
