MINISTER'S MESSAGE

At this time of year, we often think of making New Year's resolutions. Some resolve to begin exercising for the new year. Others resolve to eat better. Some may even commit to making better choices or being kinder. But, as we all know, New Year's resolutions are often broken. Why is this, and is there anything we can do to avoid the typical pitfall?

There are probably numerous reasons why we break our resolutions so easily and quickly. Perhaps we forget to schedule it on our calendar because we have yet to create the new habit. Maybe we feel uncomfortable going to the gym for the first or second time, and then we just avoid the awkwardness by quitting. There is probably, however, a common thread that makes all resolutions so difficult to keep: we try to do it on our own.

It's much more difficult to accomplish tasks by one's self. When we have a helper, it's definitely a lot easier. A helper aids in accountability, camaraderie, and motivation to stick to "it". A one-hundred-pound weight is much easier to lift with two people rather than one. The wisdom of Solmon noted the following:

Two are better than one because they have a good return for their labor. For if either of them falls, the one will lift up his companion. But woe to the one who falls when there is not another to lift him up. Furthermore, if two lie down together they keep warm, but how can one be warm alone? And if one can overpower him who is alone, two can resist him. A cord of three strands is not quickly torn apart (Eccles 4:9-12; NASB).

What is the point for us? This year let's make a good New Year's resolution and find someone in the body of Christ to follow through with us! Perhaps you desire to pray or study more. Maybe you want to try the spiritual discipline of fasting or solitude for the first time. Do not try it by yourself! Find a Christian brother or sister who is interested in making the same resolution, and then walk with one another as you begin to practice it. No one in the church of Christ is alone! We are a community Jesus has created for fellowship and edification. We cannot exist alone. As the saying goes, no man is an island. And this definitely applies to Christians! Remember: "Iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (Prov 27:17).

Moreover, consider that you have the Holy Spirit who dwells in you. He can give you the moral and spiritual strength to you and your companion to accomplish the New Year's resolution. Whenever we attempt to put into practice those things which help us become more like Christ on our own strength, we are doomed to fail. Salvation—from justification to full sanctification—is God's work. We just need to provide the Spirit the opportunity to work on us. So let's work together! That's one reason why Christ built his church!

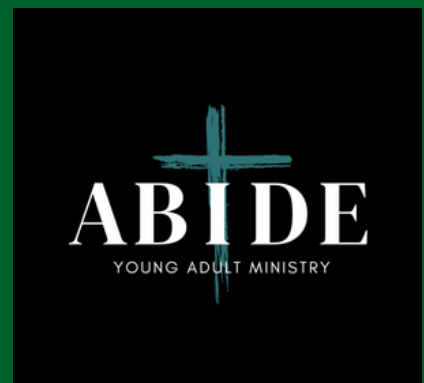

WHO ARE WE? In 2008, we landed in Guatemala. We were overwhelmed with the physical AND spiritual need. Our eyes were opened to extreme poverty, suffering children, abusive homes, absent fathers, and a corrupted version of Christianity. What we experienced changed us to the core.

Arriving without a sending organization or even a "ministry plan", we simply focused on abiding in Christ, and following as the Lord leads. We became part of a village community. We worked alongside, grieved alongside, suffered alongside, and celebrated alongside. The memories of community projects, shared meals, weddings, birthdays, funerals, tragedies, preaching, teaching, and discipling... are literally endless. These are cherished memories we will never forget.

We started the Buena Vista Sports Academy (BVSA), which uses soccer as a means to share the gospel, teach the Bible, and disciple those the Lord saves. Through soccer, we are able to get into difficult places around the world. Learn more at BvsaRhinos.com.

The number of graduates from our Academies that want to be pastors and missionaries led us to where we are today. Planting another Academy in the region of Quiché Guatemala, this site will include a Bible Institute devoted to offering Biblical studies, the training of pastors and missionaries, and church planting.

You can read more about the Quiche Project and Bible Institute at www.quicheproject.com. The Quiché Project is underway in the central highlands of Guatemala, in the predominately Mayan region of Quiché. After 10+ years of teaching the Bible and discipling young men, graduates of our academies began feeling the Lord's call into full time ministry. Without quality options nearby for furthering their study and preparation, the vision for the Quiché Project began to take shape.

In addition to the Soccer Academy, the plans for the Quiché Project include a Bible Institute focused on advanced Biblical studies, church planting, and the training and sending of Spanish-speaking pastors and missionaries. Of course, we continue receiving English-speaking missionary candidates as well.

The Quiché Bible Institute will offer further education in Bible, Theology, Pastoral Ministry, Global Missions, and more, to student residents onsite. It also gives us one location for all missionary and pastoral candidates to come and train over a longer period of time. Other short-term programs and courses will be available to anyone interested growing in their Biblical studies.





The annual Ladies Christmas Luncheon was held Saturday, Dec. 7th in the FLC, hosted by the Sisters of Grace leadership team. This year 34 women attended. The ladies enjoyed fellowship during the lunch, which was a variety of soups, breads & crackers, vegetable tray and some delicious desserts.
