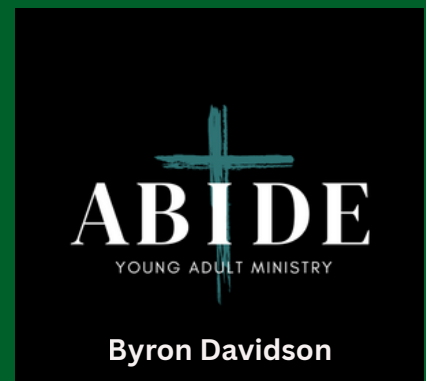

Brrr! What a cold month January has been! In Shine, we have been exploring the life of Jesus in Children’s Church, with a special focus right now on the Sermon on the Mount. Sometimes, in teaching children, we can get so focused on teaching them the stories (i.e. Biblical accounts), that we forget to teach them what Jesus taught. The New Year is here and some great things are happening or in the planning stages with our Abide Young Adult group. On Jan 2<sup>nd</sup>, although not strictly an Abide function, it did involve the same age group as Abide, we had several of our young adults participate in a Passion Watch event with Pizza and snacks. Over the last 2 years LCC has taken a combined total of 29, 18 to 25 year olds, to the Passion Conference usually held in Atlanta at Mercedes Benz Stadium or State Farm arena. Passion 2026 was held in Arlington TX this year. The price would have been prohibitive so we planned our Passion Watch 2026 for the second day of Passion, which is the longest day of Conference with some amazing speakers and music. It was a great time of worship.

We began our study on the Book of Romans just after the new year, and it’s an amazing book to reach non-Christians, for those newer in their walk and also for those who have been followers for a while. Romans is often regarded as one of the most significant books in the New Testament. The Apostle Paul outlines the core principles of Christianity, by addressing themes such as sin, grace and the transformation that comes from trusting in God. Paul emphasizes that salvation is not achieved thru sticking to the Law or the number of good deeds we do, but that salvation comes thru faith in Jesus Christ. It’s said that “you don’t get better water by digging a larger circumference well, you get better water by digging deeper”. We look forward to digging deeper into Romans.

The Children's Village has provided safety, stability, and love to vulnerable children for nearly 60 years through its residential group homes where children can heal and grow.

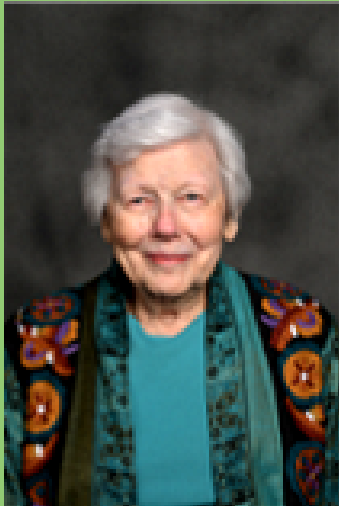
#### **Thrive**
